Last week each child who had consent was given their second and third Lateral Flow Test. The work that has gone on behind the scenes to make this happen has been truly phenomenal. All of the staff involved have worked so hard in order to make the process as smooth as possible. I want to thank you as parents for all of the support during the testing period in particular.
