## Re: Autumn Term Week 12 Headteacher Update

Unfortunately following the emergence of the Omicron variant of Covid-19 there are a number of increased measures which will take place as of tomorrow (30<sup>th</sup> November) at St James'. On Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> November, the Prime Minister announced new temporary measures following the emergence of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 in the UK. The new measures will be introduced as a precaution to slow down the spread of the variant while we gather more information. Please do be aware as further guidance is distributed by Public Health England and/or the Local Authority there may be further measures introduced.

- Face coverings; Face coverings should be worn in communal areas in all settings by staff, visitors and pupils or students in Year 7 and above, unless they are exempt. Pupils or students (in Year 7 or above) should continue to wear face coverings on public and dedicated school transport, unless they are exempt. If your child is exempt please email <a href="mailto:b.ohara@stjamescheadle.co.uk">b.ohara@stjamescheadle.co.uk</a> so that she can let staff know
- **Testing;** All educational and childcare settings should continue to encourage staff and students to test twice weekly using lateral flow device (LFD) tests.
- Contact tracing and isolation; The <u>current guidance on contact tracing and isolation</u> remains in place. In addition to these, any suspected or confirmed close contacts of the Omicron variant will be asked to isolate for 10 days regardless of vaccination status or age. You will be contacted directly and told to isolate.
- Vaccination; All eligible staff and students aged 12 and over are encouraged to take up the offer of
  the vaccine, including boosters. To book a vaccination, please visit: <u>Book or manage a coronavirus</u>
