Re: National Lockdown Week 4 Update

This week has shown a high level of engagement from students in their online learning and it has been great to hear from staff about some of the excellent work that has been produced by our St James' students. Please continue to keep our Year 11 student, who remains in a critical condition, in your thoughts and prayers.

We have seen throughout the week a wave of announcements from the Government and the Department for Education (DFE) which will impact upon us all at St James'. Firstly, on Wednesday 27th January, Mr Johnson announced that schools in England will not be able to reopen to all pupils after the February half-term but could potentially reopen to all on the 8th March. This is the earliest and "depends on lots of things going right". We will wait for any future announcements, but the planning has already begun for St James' to reopen to all on the 8th March. In the meantime, our remote learning offer remains unchanged and will continue with Form Time and five lessons per day. We continue to appreciate your support in ensuring your child's attendance at each of these sessions.

On Tuesday 26th January, The Department for Education (DFE) confirmed that schools will close as usual to all children over February half-term. To this end, St James' will close as planned on Friday 12th February and reopen to those vulnerable children and the children of critical workers on Monday 22nd February. Our remote learning offer will also cease on Friday 12th February and recommence on Monday 22nd February.
