## Re: National Lockdown Week 6 Update

I hope you have had a restful half term and managed to begin this Lenten season with hope. With Ash Wednesday, Lent begins, and we start our Lenten observances. Our Lenten observances are only a beginning, a preparation for our ongoing struggle to resist the temptations we face in our daily lives. We need to recall and remember that we are not setting out on this journey alone. When we are tempted, we need to follow the example of Jesus, whenever we feel tired or ready to give up, we need to turn to God for encouragement. We know that God will be with us during Lent, as God was with Jesus when he was in the desert as we heard in the Gospel yesterday. We continue to keep our seriously injured Year 11 student and their family in our prayers along with all members of our school family who have been or continue to be affected by the pandemic.

Over the half term week there have been a series of contradictory headlines around school re-opening, whether it will be a full or partial return to school on the 8<sup>th</sup> March, how testing may look, additional strengthening of mask wearing and what the examinations may look like for our Year 11 students. In reality I am expecting a swathe of announcements around the wider reopening of schools and the summer's awarding of examinations grades today and this week. I will be writing to you again when we have this confirmed from the Government and the Department for Education (DFE).
