## Re: Summer Term Week 9 Headteacher Update

We are now entering the final week of examinations for our Year 11 children. The children have been fantastic during this period, and we are very much looking forward to seeing the fruits of their labour on results day on 25<sup>th</sup> August. Children will be able to collect their results from 9am to 10.30am at school. If your child is unable to attend results day to collect their results, they will be posted first class to their home address so they should arrive at your child's home address on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> August. Please continue to keep all Year 11 children in your thoughts and prayers as they conclude their examinations. A reminder that we have the opportunity to celebrate with Year 11 at the Leavers' Mass which is taking place at Christ Church on 29<sup>th</sup> June at 7pm, Prom which takes place at the Village Hotel in Cheadle on 30<sup>th</sup> June at 6pm and Prize Evening in November in school.

This Thursday, 23<sup>rd</sup> June, our Year 10 Apprenticeship Evening takes place in school at 6pm. The evening will consist of a presentation delivered by Matt Leigh from the Government Apprenticeship Programme, and a Q&A session. If your child is in Year 10 and considering an apprenticeship or is unsure of what they want to do for their next steps, then this is a great opportunity to get some of the latest information about applying for apprenticeships locally. You will also be able to speak to Miss Ashworth and Mrs Rarity about how to access additional support in applying for apprenticeships as your child moves into Year 11.

As part of our commitment to our value of Family, Miss Wilde, our Deputy Director of SEND, has launched a new St James' Social Club for our children to attend. The sessions run every Wednesday from 3-4pm in CS20 as well as every Thursday lunch time in the drama room starting at 1.30pm. The club has various themes which run each week. Yesterday we celebrated the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus. The Eucharist is the source of our lives as followers of Jesus and the Body and Blood that Jesus offers to each of us calls and binds us together as disciples of Jesus and feeds, nurtures and nourishes us. Let us remember and thank God that our life and the lives of others will be transformed whenever we share what we have received and become people who imitate the love and compassion of Jesus.
