Spotlight on careers:

The next couple of pages will have some statements from people in different careers to give you an insight into what different jobs and careers are like as part of national careers week.





Lesley Dixon, Youth Worker: I began my youth work career when I was 20 years old. I had always been passionate about supporting and encouraging others to reach goals! It was during the counselling training that I realised that childhood experiences were so important, and so I became a youth worker. Youth work is varied, it's very different from when I first started, the stereotype of a youth worker playing pool is a stereotype! Youth work is so much more, it's a conversation, it's listening, it's seeing something in someone that sometimes hasn't been seen before.

I have had the privilege of watching young people grow, develop and believe in themselves, by taking part in

projects, youth councils, and using activities like abseiling, mountain walking and public speaking. Youth work is a journey, as a youth worker we learn from young people and that helps the relationship be equal, free from power and different from other relationships, for example last year I became a vegetarian because young people educated me about being more climate conscious. Victoria Vernon, Junior Doctor (GP trainee): I'm a junior doctor who is training to be a GP. I've wanted to be a doctor since I was a child! I enjoyed science at school (and historyespecially history of medicine!) I had a disabled brother who was in and out of hospital when I was growing up and this gave me the idea. 15 years later and I'm pretty sure I made the right choice. To be a doctor I needed good GSCEs and Alevels particularly in science subjects. Then I applied to study medicine at university. This was a 5-year course. After graduation I could officially call myself doctor! I then went on to "foundation training" this is a paid job as a junior doctor mostly based in hospital but with some time in a GP practice.



As a junior doctor in hospital, I spent most of my day seeing patients with my consultant, writing notes, ordering tests and scans and performing practical procedures like taking blood. I love the interaction with patients and helping them feel better. Sometimes we can't make people better and this can be difficult. Constantly changing hours when working shifts can be very tiring. You need to look after yourself and your colleagues.

What I enjoy most is seeing patients and figuring out what is wrong with them. I love working with children and the elderly. I like sticking with my patients and seeing them again. That's why I chose to continue training to become a GP. This is a further 3 years working as a doctor whilst training. There are other specialties from A&E to Radiology to Surgery. These all have their own training programs that range from 3-8 years long. So, there is something for everyone.

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Domanic Smith-Jones, Solution Engineer at Auth0: I help organisations understand how the technology I sell at Auth0 can help them to solve their business challenges. To be able to do this effectively I need to have certain skills. These include good communication skills, technical ability, and trustworthiness. Although I work closely with the sales team, it is my job to help the customer make the right decision on what they NEED. This means that sometimes, I may tell them not to buy our software at all if they could do better with something else, or I don't feel we have what they need.

Although I do have a degree (Computer Science and Management Studies) it's not 100% necessary for a role like

mine. However, it DID mean I was able to take some shortcuts in getting here. I left 6th Form College with A-Levels and worked 6 months at IBM on a pre-university scheme. I then spent 6 months working in France, and then went to Nottingham University. I left with a degree and joined the IBM Graduate Scheme as a Computer Programmer. This looks good on a CV and in some cases allowed me some leeway when looking for future roles. I OpenText with only 2 years exp when they wanted 5 because they respected the IBM Grad Scheme.

Georgia Wells, Biomedical Science: I am studying to go into research as a biomedical scientist. Following my A levels, I went to university to study pharmacology which looks at the action and effects of drugs within the body. I am now a master's student but hope to do a PhD or work for a pharmaceutical company (such as AstraZeneca). For my studies, I spend most of my time in a laboratory researching enzymes and proteins involved in cancers and how drugs target them, I then produce scientific papers based on the methods and results. I decided to go into this career because I always loved science and analytical thinking, and it is a great way to be able to help people by developing drugs and trying to find cures for diseases. The best part about my career is being able to spend time in the laboratory designing experiments and getting to analyse all the data I produce. Sometimes



days in the lab can be long and some of the experiments can become repetitive, however, I could not see myself in any other career besides science as it is really rewarding seeing your work published and contributing to scientific research.
