






ROLE ON THE WALL




In drama in order to prepare for to get into character actors often prepare a role on the wall


DESIGN

Below is a basic template for you to work on your own set design. Choose a play which you are familiar with or a story and create a design.


If you have materials at home and an old box you may like to go one further and design a 3-dimensional design however in these difficult times you may not be able to source this so don't worry.

Please label all the items on your stage and it would be a very good idea if you gave a clear description of it.




All good plays are based on a good plot. To plan this, create a story board on the next page. You can create your own story or plan it on a well-known fairy tale, play or film.


