Re: End of Term Update

Firstly, let me take this opportunity to thank all of the St James' family for making this first half term back a success. Our pupils have returned to learning both in the classroom and virtually with enthusiasm and have shown how dedicated they are to their own learning, it truly is a pleasure to have them back in school.

Despite all the new ways of working, pupils have responded well and have displayed our three values of family, faith and excellence. We have made a good start to our fundraising efforts for CAFOD having raised over £500 so far, please continue to support this great cause. Sports practices have continued in Year group bubbles, the library has had lots of events taking place and we have seen great engagement from our Year 7 students in particular. We had European Day of Languages with students showcasing their baking skills with imaginative, language themed cakes. Year 11 showed great commitment in their applications for prefect positions and are proudly wearing their prefect ties. - 1. Symptom start date
- 2. Last date in school
- 3. Test date
- 4. Result date
- 5. The names of any children they have been in contact with at break/lunchtime up to 48 hours before the onset of symptoms
- 6. The names of any children they have been in contact with during travel to and from school up to 48 hours before the onset of symptoms

Please note this email address will only respond to confirmed positive cases of children. For all other enquiries please contact <u>office@stjamescheadle.co.uk</u>

For clarity contact is defined as:

- face-to-face contact (within one metre)
- coughed on
- face-to-face conversation within one metre
- skin-to-skin physical contact
- contact within one metre for one minute or longer without face-to-face contact
- been within 2 metres for more than 15 minutes
- travelled in a vehicle
