Spotlight on Careers



Felix Ling: My name is Felix and I work as an Organising Assistant for the National Education Union (NEU). The NEU is a trade union for teachers and other education workers and is the largest education union in Europe, with nearly half a million members. We campaign for better pay and conditions for our members and provide them with legal support if they have problems at work. If necessary, this means taking industrial action or 'going on strike'. My job in the organising team is to recruit more members and organise them to become more involved in their workplace, as well as support our national campaigns. Sometimes I have to send emails to tens of thousands of members per month, along with countless texts and phone calls. I also take part in campaigns and lobby politicians to change the education system for the better, but we also support climate strikes and movements such as Black Lives Matter. I got into union work through politics as I previously worked for an MP, and the NEU supported me in this. The best part of my job is speaking to members about their issues and organising them

to organise themselves. The worst part is seeing how the hard work of teachers and students is not rewarded properly, and when the NEU is ignored by the Government

Cat Eccles, ODP: When I left school, I had no idea what I wanted to do. I knew I liked helping people, so I joined the ambulance service doing non-emergency patient transport. Through this I found out about ODPs (Operating Department Practitioners). I studied at Birmingham City University, attending lectures and also learning on the job on placements at local hospitals. We are the hidden heroes of the hospitals, working hard in theatres and many other areas besides. There are 3 areas in operating theatres - anaesthetics, scrub/surgery, and recovery. ODPs are trained to work in all of these areas, in all different specialities. We work side by side with surgeons, anaesthetists, nurses, radiographers and many more. We can also be found in other areas performing airway skills, such as in MRI, CT scans, A&E, and obstetrics. More recently, during the pandemic, our skills were required to assist in ICU looking after the most poorly patients. I love my job because I know I'm helping make a difference to people's lives. I get to see all kinds of surgery and we never stop learning as new treatments are developing all the time. No two days are ever the same and there are lots of opportunities to progress in the future.
