

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Public Health England (PHE) is the body through whom all of the latest guidance and information is being produced and distributed. Schools have been advised to include links to the resources rather than producing their own or downloading information produced by others. This means that the latest information will be available through the links rather than schools needing to update already downloaded information as and when new information becomes available.

- the role the public can play in supporting this response, now and in the future

Current advice remains in place: **No school should close in response to a suspected (or confirmed) COVID-19 case unless advised to do so by Public Health England.**
