Dear Students, Parents and Carers

RE: Year 11 Prize Evening

When I wrote to you back in September, we had hoped we would be able to gather on 12th November for GCSE Prize Evening to celebrate our students' results and present them with their certificates. It is with regret that we have taken the decision to cancel this event due to the current Covid-19 restrictions in place.

It is normally a lovely occasion to gather with our former pupils, to congratulate them on their results and find out how the next stage of their educational or training journey is progressing. Even though we are unable to gather in person to do this, we remain immensely proud of what they achieved during the most difficult of circumstances, it was not how we imagined the class of 2020 would leave St James'.
