## Re: Spring Term Week 1 Headteacher Update

I hope you enjoyed a wonderful Christmas surrounded by friends and family, and I would like to wish you all a very happy New Year.

As we begin this half term, we look forward to lighter mornings, longer days, and the opportunities they bring. This is an essential period for all our children, regardless of Year group, to ensure their learning remains effective, productive, and focused on enhancing progress. In our lessons, we will continue delivering a broad, balanced, and diverse curriculum that develops our students into global Catholic citizens.

Our last Ofsted inspection took place in February 2022 we are therefore expecting our next inspection to take place this academic year. As you may be aware Ofsted's new framework brings major changes: a new 5-point grading scale, more detailed "report cards" with colour-coding, and separate 'met/not met' judgments for safeguarding, with a greater focus on inclusion, wellbeing, attendance, behaviour and achievement.
