Yet, as we journey through this week, we are reminded that this jubilant reception quickly gives way to the sombre events of Christ's passion and crucifixion. This Easter break, I'm thrilled to remind parents/carers that our school is offering a remarkable adventure. On Friday, March 29th, a group of our children will venture to Iceland for an immersive, exciting experience. On Wednesday last week I was spoken to by the Local Authority around the prevalence of "Vapes" being used by young people.
