This recognition celebrates the countless hours devoted to early identification, inclusive teaching, and strong leadership rooted in the belief that every child matters. At St James', all children, regardless of their starting points, needs, or backgrounds, are truly valued members of our family. This award stands as a powerful endorsement of our inclusive culture and the profound impact it has on the lives and outcomes of our young people.

As we approach the end of term, I would like to extend my sincere thanks for your continued support of St James' throughout this first term. It has certainly been a lengthy one, yet it seems to have passed remarkably quickly.
