## Re: Autumn Term Week 15 Headteacher Update

Firstly, I would like to start by thanking all of you for your continued support of the school throughout this first term. This has been an extremely long term, but it seems to have raced by. Looking back over the last 15 weeks has been a pleasure and once again the St James' family have lived out our core Values. Our Autumn Term newsletter will be sent out to you this week and I ask that you read it, especially for your child's specific Year group. It really does highlight the fantastic school, children and staff we have.

Our Expressive Arts faculty are putting on our Christmas concert tomorrow. I am sure this will be a phenomenal performance. A huge thank you to all families and friends who are supporting the event. On 28<sup>th</sup> March 2022 the Government set out its White Paper which stated there was a new minimum expectation length of the school week of 32.5 hours for all mainstream, state-funded schools. This requirement must be implemented by 1<sup>st</sup> September 2024. In order to meet this minimum expectation, St James' is proposing to change the hours from 8.45am to 3pm to 8.40am to 3.10pm. This change will allow us to have a slightly longer lunchtime and slightly longer registration time.
