Re: Spring Term Week 2 Headteacher Update

Our Year 9 Parents' Evening took place on Thursday last week with strong attendance at this virtual event. As always, thank you to all Year 9 parents who attended and submitted their feedback to the parental voice questionnaire that was sent out by Dr Guscott. I would like to remind you of our school policy regarding electronic devices, particularly smartwatches. It has come to our attention that a number of children have received smartwatches as Christmas presents. While we understand the appeal of such devices, we would like to reiterate that smartwatches are considered a banned item within the school premises. In an effort to ensure a smooth transition and to give our children ample time to adjust, our staff will spend the upcoming week reminding children to keep their smartwatches away, switched off, and securely stored in their bags during school hours. However, starting from Monday, January 29th, any smartwatches found on children will be confiscated and placed in the school safe. They will be held there until a parent or carer can collect them. We appreciate your cooperation in maintaining a focused and distraction-free learning environment for all our children.

Christ Church, St Ann's & St Chad's have confirmed the dates for their Confirmation programme for 2024. If you have a child in **Year 8 or above**, who would like to join the programme, please email the parish as soon as possible to receive a registration form. There will be an enrolment ceremony for the candidates at the 11am Mass on Sunday 28th January.

Yesterday, we reflected on the Gospel readings that remind us of the importance of recognising and responding to God's call in our lives. Jesus meets Andrew's brother Simon. He looks at him and says, "You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas, meaning Rock." The new name must have filled Peter's friends with astonishment. 'A rock' Peter certainly was not.
