Re: Autumn Term Week 6 Headteacher Update

On Thursday last week, we celebrated our Year 7 Welcome Mass at Our Lady and the Apostles Church in Edgeley. It was lovely to see so many parents and families at this event supporting their child's formal induction into the St James' family. Fr Martin spoke about the journey that our children are undertaking as well as the importance of seizing the opportunities that are afforded to the children. We look forward to seeing the children pick up their pebbles and watch them develop into diamonds over the next 5 years.

This year we will once again be supporting CAFOD as our school charity, a huge thank you to all families who donated to our Family Fast Day on Friday via ParentPay, it is not too late to do so if you are able. Our children have already been thinking about charity fundraising ideas and we appreciate the generosity of our school Family to those in the greatest need. In assemblies last week, Mrs Pickles and our Year 11 Faith Prefects shared information about CAFOD and the work they day, one of CAFOD's tag lines is "No one beyond reach" and this is something we want to contribute to during our fundraising efforts this year. We will also be doing our annual Foodbank collection in the run up to Christmas and more information will follow about this after the October half term.

As I am sure you are aware our school continues to benefit from Diocese building projects. Over the last few years, these have seen us replace ceilings, install a new Food and Nutrition room, and gain a new fire alarm. However, we are required to fund 10% of the costs. Please can I ask that you look out for the Building Fund letter which will be sent this week by our School Business Manager and support if you can.

Our school is currently working hard on sustainability, and we are working towards attaining the Eco School Award. This week we have welcomed four trainee teachers from both Manchester Metropolitan University and the University of Manchester. The owner then sends more workers into the vineyard but sadly these workers are

This week we look forward to seeing what sort of fruits and harvest the children and staff at St James' will produce through our ordinary daily lives as followers of Jesus.
