As I shared with you in last week's letter, our chosen school charity for this year is CAFOD. I am delighted to share with you that we have already raised £308 through donations on ParentPay, a huge thank you for your generosity. We have already seen our first school charity events taking place with one of our Year 11 Forms organising a successful cake sale on Thursday of last week. This continues this week with 11C hosting their cake sale on Thursday.

This week at Mass I was reminded that there is nothing quite like a good meal with friends and family! Whenever we share a meal with those we love, we experience a sense of joy, community and belonging. The same was true at the time of Jesus. The first reading tells us that the Lord will prepare a meal of rich food and wine, remove the veil of sadness and that all people will be invited to this celebration. In the Gospel, Jesus continues this message. The meal is prepared but those invited give various excuses as to why they could not come to the feast. In response, the king invited and welcomed strangers, good and bad alike. Jesus too calls us all by our name and invites us personally to come to the feast but it is up to us whether or not we accept this invitation. When we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, Jesus is the host and we are his guests. The Eucharist is offered to us freely and we are invited to respond freely. God invites us all but in return he asks us to repent for our sins. As Pope Francis reminds us, 'the Eucharist is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak... the church is a place for everyone, with all their problems.' Thinking about our school values of Family and Faith, I would encourage you to speak to your children about this invitation from God and how they can respond to it.

I hope you have a fantastic week and an extra special half term break when it comes. Thank you for your continued support throughout this half term. Our staff will be taking a well-deserved break over half term and as such will be unavailable via email for that week, thank you in advance for not contacting them.
