Re: Celebration of the Word- Half Term Four, Week Eight

This week, we continue our journey through the Lenten season, a time filled with hope, joy and renewal. The resurrection of Christ reminds us that light triumphs over darkness, and that new beginnings are always possible through faith.

Our Gospel reading for this week's Celebration of the Word is taken from John 8:1-11. In this powerful passage, Jesus is confronted with a woman caught in adultery. Those around her are ready to condemn her, but Jesus responds with compassion and wisdom: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." One by one, the accusers leave, and Jesus offers the woman forgiveness instead of judgment. This Gospel reminds us of the importance of forgiveness, the need to avoid hypocrisy, and the power of compassion in transforming our lives.

Our children continue to collect for St Joseph's Penny, with the much-anticipated penny race drawing closer. Thank you to all who have supported this effort so far; your kindness truly makes a difference to those most in need. Donations can still be made via ParentPay.
