RE: Celebration of the Word - Week Seven & Feast of St. Teresa of Avila

This week's Gospel reading is **Mark 10:17-30**. It is a Gospel that is closely linked to our School Ethos and Mission Statement: "To ensure everyone within our school **family** achieves their full potential, to encourage learning and development through **faith**, and to strive for **excellence**." In this wonderful passage, Jesus speaks with a rich young man, challenging him to give up his worldly possessions and follow Him. When the man hesitates and walks away, Jesus reminds His disciples, "With man this is impossible, but not with God; all things are possible with God." For our children, this Gospel teaches that while some challenges in our daily lives may seem overwhelming at times, with faith and trust in God, they can overcome any obstacle and live out our school mission statement. This Gospel shows us that true fulfilment comes not from material possessions but from living out our **faith**, showing kindness to others within our school **family**, and striving to reach our full potential with God's help.

As we celebrate the Feast of **St. Teresa of Avila**, a Saint known for her deep spirituality, we reflect on her teachings about the power of prayer and trust in God's guidance. This connects to our new **meditative prayer group**, led by our Faith Prefects, which will take place on **Wednesdays at lunchtime in our Chapel**. Participation is voluntary for all pupils, offering them a peaceful space to reflect, pray, and deepen their faith. It's a wonderful opportunity for our students to grow spiritually and find calm amidst the busy school day.

We are also pleased to announce that we will be hosting a **whole school Mass** on 1st **November 2024** in celebration of **All Saints' Day at 11:30am in the Sports Hall**. Father Mark from St Winifred's Parish has kindly agreed to celebrate with us to mark this Feast Day within school. We would love to invite members of our children's family to join us, but as space is limited, attendance will be on a first-come, first-served basis.
