Re: Sharing in the Prayer Life of St James' Catholic High School

This Sunday 21st **September was the 25**th **Sunday in Ordinary time.** The Gospel reading was from Luke Chapter 16. *'No servant can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.'* Some of our children attended 11am Mass at Our Lady and the Apostles Church last week and we were presented with a blessed **picture of Saint Carlos Acutis.** You can see this in the Chapel.

Our Catholic Social Teaching Focus: This week, we are focussing on the Catholic Social Teaching – The dignity of work and the rights of others. We are thinking about the rights of workers to be treated with respect and given a fair wage.

Monday 22nd September is the beginning of Fairtrade Fortnight.

In faith and family time, children will be asked to think about what motivates them. They will be learning about what the Fairtrade symbol means, and learning about the work of CAFOD.

KS3 children will have a lesson in the chapel and we will be reflecting on the 'Visitation', when Mary visited her sister Elizabeth. This is because next week we will be receiving an icon of a stained, glass window from Shrewsbury Cathedral, which is being passed around the schools in the Diocese. We will be praying the Angelus.
