This week's Celebration of the Word focuses on the Epiphany that was celebrated on 6th January, in the gospel of Matthew, we hear the story of how some wise men from another part of the world were led by a star and travelled the long journey to Bethlehem, looking for Jesus. They found him in a stable. This feast of the Epiphany is a significant and important one for people of every race and nationality, because the wise men represent God's people throughout the world. The Son of God, the Word made flesh, came into the world as a Jew, to give life and salvation to every member of the human race.
