This week's Celebration of the Word focuses on the feast day of St James the Lesser, the Patron Saint of our school, his feast day is celebrated on 3rd May.

St. James the Lesser, also known as James the Just, was a significant figure in the early Christian Church and one of the original apostles of Jesus. He was the son of Alphaeus and Mary, and was likely a relative of Jesus. He is mentioned several times in the New Testament. He was a humble man who gave his life in the service of others and is also remembered for his commitment to justice and to the poor. He was known to be a defender of the poor and the oppressed, and he worked tirelessly to bring about change and to promote fairness and equality.

Our Form Tutors will share with children how we can learn some lessons from St James the Lesser:

Devotion to God

Faithfulness in the face of adversity

St James faced many challenges and even persecution in his life, we can learn from his example the importance of remaining faithful to our beliefs and values, even in difficult times.

This links to the Catholic Social Teaching Principle of Dignity. We are all created Imago Dei, in the image and likeness of God and should treat each person as such, just as St James the Lesser did.
