Sunday 25th January, was Week 3 of Ordinary time, Year A. This Sunday, we focussed on The Word of God so this week in Faith and Family time, we will focus on words.

The Gospel reading was from Matthew Chapter 4 verses 12-23. ***"Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people."*** We will be focussing on the core value of Excellence and the Catholic Social teaching of Rights and Responsibilities.

*'...the people living in darkness
have seen a great light;
on those living in the land of the shadow of death
a light has dawned.'*

Jesus is referred to as the 'light of the world' because his teaching, which involved his careful use of words, enables people to 'see the light' and to understand God's love for us.

Last week, it was announced that the words 'six, seven' were almost voted the 2025 children's word of the year, but fortunately, that title was given to a much more powerful and meaningful word, '**Peace**'. We will be focussing on the fact that all human beings have the right to live in peace and a responsibility not to spoil other people's peace.

On Tuesday 27th January, it is Holocaust Memorial Day. This year, the theme is, 'It started with words.' This day is a memorial to the killing of six million Jews, and millions of others, including 3.3 million Soviet POWs, 1.8 million Polish civilians, and hundreds of thousands of others between 1941 and 1945.

This week, we are thinking about how sometimes we use words that we don't understand. Sometimes, we use words that spread rumours and harm others. The holocaust began with words.

Being betrayed by someone we trust is horrible. As humans, we need friendships and relationships which are only successful, if they are built on trust.

On 'Faithful Friday' this week, we will reflect on a theme of treachery and faithfulness (fidelity). On TV, it is just a game but in the real world, making assumptions about people, and believing rumours is dangerous and cruel. Careless words or actions can destroy a relationship and ripple throughout society and even generations. It sows distrust, preventing families, communities and nations from flourishing as they should. When we are betrayed it cuts deep and relationships can break down beyond repair.
