
LABOUR MARKET INFORMATION FACT

Challenge 1: AI is already a big part of your daily life — and it's only getting bigger. But even the smartest AI can get things wrong. In this short, high-impact Sprint, you'll step into the role of a tech professional at Amazon. Challenge 2: If you're getting Level 3 results this year and planning to go to university, use these 6 steps from UCAS to get results day ready!


